

# Dubai Solar Power Station Winning Bid Announcement

Who bids for Dubai solar park?

The Dubai Electricity and Water Authority (DEWA) announced it received two bids from ACWA Power and Masdar for the tender it launched in September 2022 for the 1,800 MW 6th phase of the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park. The utility said Masdar submitted the lowest bid of \$0.0162154/kWh.

Who bid for Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum solar park?

Photo: Dewa Dubai Electricity and Water Authority has received two bids from ACWA Power and Masdar for the sixth phase of the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park. Masdar submitted the lowest bid of \$1.62154 cents per kilowatt hour.

When will Dubai solar park be fully operational?

The 800MW third phase of the solar park using photovoltaic solar panels became fully operational in 2020. In June 2016, DEWA announced the Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company (Masdar) led consortium as selected bidder for the 800MW third phase of the solar park using photovoltaic solar panels.

When will the 6th phase of Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum solar park start?

It expects the 6th phase of the giant project to begin commercial operations in the fourth quarter of 2024. DEWA had selected 23 bidders in the initial phase of the tender. The 5th phase of the 5 GW Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park has a capacity of 900 MW and is currently under construction.

Is Dewa a good choice for solar power projects based on IPP?

"DEWA has broken its own record and achieved the lowest price for PV solar power projects based on the IPP model in Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park," said DEWA CEO Saeed Mohammed Al Tayer. DEWA said it will announce the preferred bidder in the third quarter of this year.

What is Dubai's Solar Park mega project?

Dubai's solar park mega project now accounts for more than 15 per cent of the emirate's energy production capacity. When completed in 2030, the solar park will help offset more than 6.5 million tonnes of carbon emissions annually. Dubai aims to meet all of its power needs using clean energy sources by 2050.

DUBAI - Abu Dhabi's department of energy has postponed the announcement of the winning bids for developing a 1.5 gigawatt (GW) solar power plant in the Al Dhafra region, state news agency WAM reported late on Wednesday.

DEWA has, in the last few days, announced the launch of phase IV, an IPP for a 200-MW concentrated solar power plant. All four phases of the Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park are part of a DEWA-backed plan to invest US\$3.3 billion in solar power in Dubai as part of a wider goal of installing 3,000

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megawatts of solar PV by 2030.
